Today's Worship

Forty days ago, the darkness of Lent was dispelled by the light of Easter. For forty days, the Church has cried, "Christ is risen! He is risen indeed!" But forty days after Jesus rose from the dead, he departed from his disciples and was enthroned in glory in heaven. From heaven he rules all things as our Lord and King. Today we celebrate the day he ascended ("went up") to glory. But he promised not to leave his disciples alone. He promised to send them the Holy Spirit. They waited ten more days, and then on the Festival of Pentecost ("fiftieth day") they saw Jesus' promise made good. Next Sunday, we will celebrate that 50th day, the day of Pentecost. While Jesus leaving the visible presence of his disciples might seem like a loss, Jesus was ascending back to heaven, because he was victorious, having conquered sin, death, and hell, the work of salvation completed. And that means we're victorious, too! That's the best good news, a victory we want to share with all people!


The Season of Easter

The Easter season is 50 days long and consists of 8 Sundays: from Easter to Pentecost. The Sundays of Easter remind us that Easter is more than just one day on the calendar. Instead, it is a continued celebration of Jesus' resurrection from the dead and his victory over Satan.

INTROIT

- M: Praise the Lord from the heavens; praise him in the heights above.
- C: Praise him, all his angels; praise him, all his heavenly hosts.
- M: How majestic is the Lord's name in all the earth!
- C: He has set his glory above the heavens.
- M: For the Lord is the Most High over all the earth.
- C: He is exalted far above all gods.
- M: God has ascended amid shouts of joy, the Lord amid the sounding of trumpets.
- C: God reigns over the nations; God is seated on his holy throne.

CONFESSION OF SINS

- M: Brothers and sisters in Christ, since we have been raised with Christ let us look up with confidence to him, who is now ascended and sits at the right hand of God in glory and power.
- C: He is able to save us completely when we come to God through him, because he always lives to intercede for us.
- M: Let us come before our God, then, in humble honesty in regard to our sin and in grateful expectation in regard to his forgiveness.
- C: Merciful Father in heaven, we know we only deceive ourselves if we say we have no sin. In all honesty, we must confess that we have sinned and deserve condemnation. But you have placed your name on us in Holy Baptism. You have declared us to be your own. You invite us to confess our sins, trusting in your Son, our Savior Jesus. Hear our prayer, Father, and hear the intercession of your ascended Son. Grant us pardon and peace in him.

- M: Hear the Good News again! The Son of God was delivered over to death for your sins and was raised again for your justification. In his name and with his authority, I say to you: You are forgiven. Now, live new lives in the power of the Holy Spirit.
- C: Since we have been raised with Christ, let us set our minds on things above, not on earthly things. Then we will have the full measure of his joy within us.

M: In the peace of forgiveness, let us praise the Lord.

PRAYER OF THE DAY*

M: Let us pray.

Lord Jesus, King of glory, on this day you ascended far above the heavens and at God's right hand you rule the nations. Leave us not alone, we pray, but grant us the Spirit of truth that at your command and by your power we may be your witnesses in all the world; for you live and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.



Prayer Note

The Venerable Bede was an English monk who lived around 700 AD. Known as "the Teacher of the Middle Ages," Bede's best known contribution is the system of dating events by years before or after Christ. Bede died in 735 AD on the Feast of the Ascension, and the words he spoke on his deathbed serve as the Prayer of the Day for the Festival of the Ascension of our Lord. The words themselves flow from the great ascension texts. The prayer sets the tone for the Sunday, beginning with a note of triumph and ending with a supplication for the Spirit and His Work on Pentecost. Today we see that Christ rules all things for his Church.

THE WORD

FIRST LESSON: ACTS 1:1-11 You Will Be My Witnesses

1 In my former book, Theophilus, I wrote about all that Jesus began to do and to teach ² until the day he was taken up to heaven, after giving instructions through the Holy Spirit to the apostles he had chosen. ³ After his suffering, he presented himself to them and gave many convincing proofs that he was alive. He appeared to them over a period of forty days and spoke about the kingdom of God. ⁴On one occasion, while he was eating with them, he gave them this command: "Do not leave Jerusalem, but wait for the gift my Father promised, which you have heard me speak about. ⁵ For John baptized with water, but in a few days you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit." ⁶ Then they gathered around him and asked him, "Lord, are you at this time going to restore the kingdom to Israel?" ⁷ He said to them: "It is not for you to know the times or dates the Father has set by his own authority. ⁸ But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth."

⁹ After he said this, he was taken up before their very eyes, and a cloud hid him from their sight. ¹⁰ They were looking intently up into the sky as he was going, when suddenly two men dressed in white stood beside them. ¹¹ "Men of Galilee," they said, "why do you stand here looking into the sky? This same Jesus, who has been taken from you into heaven, will come back in the same way you have seen him go into heaven."

M: The Word of the Lord.

C: Thanks be to God.

seated at the right hand of God. ²Set your minds on things above, not on earthly things. ³For you

GOSPEL: Luke 24:44-53

The Ascension of Christ

⁴⁴He said to them, "This is what I told you while I was still with you: Everything must be fulfilled that is written about me in the Law of Moses, the Prophets and the Psalms." 45 Then he opened their

minds so they could understand the Scriptures. 46 He told them, "This is what is written: The

Messiah will suffer and rise from the dead on the third day, 47 and repentance for the forgiveness of

sins will be preached in his name to all nations, beginning at Jerusalem. 48 You are witnesses of these

things. ⁴⁹ I am going to send you what my Father has promised; but stay in the city until you have

been clothed with power from on high." 50 When he had led them out to the vicinity of Bethany, he

lifted up his hands and blessed them. 51 While he was blessing them, he left them and was taken up

into heaven. 52 Then they worshiped him and returned to Jerusalem with great joy. 53 And they

stayed continually at the temple, praising God.




GOSPEL RESPONSE A Hymn of Glory Let Us Sing Christian Worship (Red) 171 vs. 1,3,6

Worship Note

During the singing of the Gospel Response, the Paschal Candle (the large candle in the front of church which has been burning during the Sundays since Easter) is extinguished to symbolize that Jesus did not remain with his Church in bodily form, but returned to his heavenly Father's right hand in glory. This does not imply that Jesus is no longer present among us, for he promised, "Where two or three come together in my name, there am I with them" (Matthew 18:20). Wherever his Word and Sacraments are, there Jesus is truly present. The extinguishing of the Paschal candle helps us to remember that Jesus does not himself carry the gospel in Word and Sacraments to the world, but has appointed us to "go and make disciples of all nations" (Matthew 28:20). With Jesus' power and presence, we are indeed witnesses of grace.

CONFESSION OF FAITH

Explanation of the 2nd Article of the Apostles' Creed



- C: Lord Jesus, come quickly. Amen.


LORD'S PRAYER
