TODAY'S WORSHIP:

In all of today's Scripture readings, we see people faithfully listening to God's calling to them. From Samuel's "speak, Lord, your servant is listening" to Philip's "Come and see" invitation to the skeptical Nathanael, we see the results when people meet the God and Savior they've been waiting for. And yet, it is God who does the calling. It is God who first addresses them. And in that, we see that although God's people were waiting for the arrival of the Savior for thousands of years, he had also been waiting for them. Waiting for the perfect time to call them to himself, so that they might follow him, and be messengers inviting others to come and see the good news of a Savior who calls us to be his own.

The Season of Epiphany

The season of Epiphany celebrates the many different ways that Jesus is revealed as the Savior of the world. After the Festival of Epiphany, which focuses on the visit of the Wise Men, the season is bookended by festivals that typify the revealing of Jesus' divinity: the Baptism of our Lord and the Transfiguration. On the other Sundays in the season, we see Jesus revealed as the promised Messiah through his miracles, ministry, message, and mission work. The color of the season is green, associated with growth. During this season, we celebrate the growth of the Church as the Savior is proclaimed to the nations.





M: For patience and perseverance in this life, that we may not lose the hope of heaven as we await your return, hear our prayer, O Lord.





3 The boy Samuel ministered before the LORD under Eli. In those days the word of the Lord was rare; there were not many visions. ²One night Eli, whose eyes were becoming so weak that he could barely see, was lying down in his usual place. ³ The lamp of God had not yet gone out, and Samuel was lying down in the house of the LORD, where the ark of God was. 4 Then the LORD called Samuel. Samuel answered, "Here I am." ⁵ And he ran to Eli and said, "Here I am; you called me." But Eli said, "I did not call; go back and lie down." So he went and lay down. 6 Again the LORD called, "Samuel!" And Samuel got up and went to Eli and said, "Here I am; you called me." "My son," Eli said, "I did not call; go back and lie down." 7Now Samuel did not yet know the Lord: The word of the Lord had not yet been revealed to him. 8 A third time the Lord called, "Samuel!" And Samuel got up and went to Eli and said, "Here I am; you called me." Then Eli realized that the Lord was calling the boy. 9So Eli told Samuel, "Go and lie down, and if he calls you, say, 'Speak, LORD, for your servant is listening." So Samuel went and lay down in his place. ¹⁰ The Lord came and stood there, calling as at the other times, "Samuel! Samuel!" Then Samuel said, "Speak, for your servant is listening."







Can anything good come from there?" Nathanael asked. "Come and see," said Philip. ⁴⁷When Jesus saw Nathanael approaching, he said of him, "Here truly is an Israelite in whom there is no deceit." ⁴⁸ "How do you know me?" Nathanael asked. Jesus answered, "I saw you while you were still under the fig tree before Philip called you." ⁴⁹Then Nathanael declared, "Rabbi, you are the Son of God; you are the king of Israel." ⁵⁰Jesus said, "You believe because I told you I saw you under the fig tree. You will see greater things than that." ⁵¹He then added, "Very truly I tell you, you will see 'heaven open, and the angels of God ascending and descending on' the Son of Man."

CONFESSION OF FAITH Nicene Creed
