SERVICE OF THE WORD

This service offers the congregation a form of worship that focuses on the proclamation of God's Word. Believers respond to this divine gift with prayer, praise, and thanksgiving.

HYMN SING SUNDAY

M: The grace of our Lord (+) Jesus Christ and the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you.

C: And also with you.

CONFESSION OF SINS

- M: Our Savior Jesus tells us, "Go, and make disciples of all nations,"
- C: "Baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you."
- M: And yet, so often we have failed to heed his calling. Therefore, let us confess our sins before God, and plead for his mercy.
- C: Merciful Father in heaven, so often, we have failed to go and make disciples of all nations. You have given us so many opportunities to share the Gospel, but so often we've failed to seize them. We have been apathetic, or resistant to share the good news of Jesus with people who need to hear about him. We've placed our earthly desires for comfort or convenience ahead of the needs of people's eternal souls. For these, and all our sins, we ask you to have mercy on us, according to your unfailing love. Cleanse me from my sin, and take away my guilt.
- M: Our Lord tells us, "How beautiful are the feet of those who bring good news, who proclaim peace, who bring good tidings, who proclaim salvation." Dear brothers and sisters, there is good news to share! God our heavenly Father has forgiven all your sins.

By Jesus' perfect life and innocent death, he has removed your guilt forever. As a called servant of the Gospel which Jesus tells us to go and share, I forgive you all your sins, in the name of the Father, and of the Son (+), and of the Holy Spirit.

C: Amen.

M: Motivated by this good news, may we go out into the world and proclaim the message of salvation through faith in Christ to all nations, to all people, to every mission field that God gives us; those abroad, and those in our own backyard. And in the peace of forgiveness, let us praise the Lord!



PRAYER OF THE DAY

M: Let us pray. Merciful Father, your kindness caused the light of the gospel to shine among us. Use us now as instruments of your love to reach out with the message of salvation to all people. Bless those who labor in the mission fields of our nation and world, and grant success to their witness that many may be freed from sin; through Jesus Christ our Lord.



FIRST READING: Jonah 4 Jonah's anger at the Lord's compassion

But to Jonah this seemed very wrong, and he became angry. ²He prayed to the LORD, "Isn't this what I said, LORD, when I was still at home? That is what I tried to forestall by fleeing to Tarshish. I knew that you are a gracious and compassionate God, slow to anger and abounding in love, a God who relents from sending calamity. ³Now, LORD, take away my life, for it is better for me to die than to live." ⁴But the LORD replied, "Is it right for you to be angry?" ⁵ Jonah had gone out and sat down at a place east of the city. There he made himself a shelter, sat in its shade and waited to see what would happen to the city. ⁶ Then the LORD God provided a leafy plant and made it grow up over Jonah to give shade for his head to ease his discomfort, and Jonah was very happy about the plant. 7 But at dawn the next day God provided a worm, which chewed the plant so that it withered. ⁸When the sun rose, God provided a scorching east wind, and the sun blazed on Jonah's head so that he grew faint. He wanted to die, and said, "It would be better for me to die than to live." 9 But God said to Jonah, "Is it right for you to be angry about the plant?" "It is," he said. "And I'm so angry I wish I were dead." ¹⁰ But the LORD said, "You have been concerned about this plant, though you did not tend it or make it grow. It sprang up overnight and died overnight.

¹¹ And should I not have concern for the great city of Nineveh, in which there are more than a hundred and twenty thousand people who cannot tell their right hand from their left—and also many animals?"

M: The Word of the Lord.

¹³Who is wise and understanding among you? Let them show it by their good life, by deeds done in the humility that comes from wisdom. ¹⁴But if you harbor bitter envy and selfish ambition in your hearts, do not boast about it or deny the truth. ¹⁵Such "wisdom" does not come down from heaven but is earthly, unspiritual, demonic. ¹⁶For where you have envy and selfish ambition, there you find disorder and every evil practice. ¹⁷But the wisdom that comes from heaven is first of all pure; then peaceloving, considerate, submissive, full of mercy and good fruit, impartial and sincere. ¹⁸Peacemakers who sow in peace reap a harvest of righteousness. M: The Word of the Lord.

VERSE OF THE DAY



GOSPEL: Mark 9:30-37 A servant to all

³⁰ They left that place and passed through Galilee. Jesus did not want anyone to know where they were, ³¹ because he was teaching his disciples. He said to them, "The Son of Man is going to be delivered into the hands of men. They will kill him, and after three days he will rise." ³² But they did not understand what he meant and were afraid to ask him about it. ³³ They came to Capernaum. When he was in the house, he asked them, "What were you arguing about on the road?" ³⁴ But they kept quiet because on the way they had argued about who was the greatest.

³⁵Sitting down, Jesus called the Twelve and said, "Anyone who wants to be first must be the very last, and the servant of all." ³⁶He took a little child whom he placed among them. Taking the child in his arms, he said to them, ³⁷ "Whoever welcomes one of these little children in my name welcomes me; and whoever welcomes me does not welcome me but the one who sent me.
