#### **TODAY'S WORSHIP:**

When Jesus comes back as judge, everyone will face a binary outcome. Either they will be judged as righteous and experience the peace and joys of Paradise, or they will be judged as wicked and suffer unquenchable fire (Matthew 3). John the Baptist's job was to point to the only way to prepare for that Judgment, one where the stakes are high. Repent! And look to the Lord Jesus. For when Jesus came into our world the first time, it was not as judge, but as Savior. All those whose faith is in Christ have already been judged righteous. Please, take these words to heart: the reign of God draws near, and his judgment is inevitable. As John the Baptist once said, "All people will see God's salvation." The only question is if one sees Christ's second coming with joy or regret. For those who fail to repent, the coming of the Judge brings terror and certain doom. But his people will see that Judge like a banner on the hilltop, rallying us to his glorious side.

#### Worship Series: Come, Lord Jesus!

The Latin word *adventus* means "coming." The last words in Scripture are "Come, Lord Jesus!" Thus, the season of Advent begins with the end in mind. We enter a new Church Year with our eyes fixed on the End—when Jesus Christ will come and destroy this sin-broken world. If that is what Jesus and his angels are coming to do, why would we cry out, "Come, Lord Jesus"? Because we know that Jesus has come into our world once before. The Son of God became the Son of Man. From the manger to the cross, Jesus did everything necessary to redeem mankind. As this new Church Year walks us through the entire life of Christ, we see God's promises of deliverance fulfilled, God's plan of salvation completed. And so, when Christ comes again, while the universe will be destroyed, we know God's people will be ushered into a new, glorious, everlasting kingdom. Advent is necessary to prepare us for Christmas. It enables us to understand the true significance of Christmas. For Advent allows us to see that because of what Christ did when he came the first time, believers need not fear when he comes again. Instead, we yearn for it. Come, Lord Jesus!

with his innocent suffering and death.


Trusting in him, I pray: God, have mercy on me, a sinner.


Silence for meditation and reflection

#### LORD, HAVE MERCY Kyrie






- M: We light two Advent candles, remembering Jesus, who came into our world of sin and death.
- C: We remember Jesus, who came as the promised Messiah, whose way was prepared by the forerunner, John the Baptist.
- M: We hear his call to repent. For the kingdom of heaven is near, and the Judge will one day return.
- C: We light two Advent candles as a sign of our repentance and desire for renewal.
- M: Come, Lord Jesus, be our guest.
- C: Through your Word and Spirit may our souls be blessed.

#### LIGHTING OF THE ADVENT CANDLE

Pastor will sing the opening verse and Alleluia. The congregation then repeats the alleluia, and sings the concluding verse as two Advent candles are lit.

M: (Sung) Prepare the way of the Lord. All flesh shall see the salvation of God.

## FIRST READING: Isaiah 11:1-10 The Judge of righteousness and justice

<sup>1</sup>A shoot will come up from the stump of Jesse; from his roots a Branch will bear fruit.

<sup>2</sup>The Spirit of the Lord will rest on him—the Spirit of wisdom and of understanding, the Spirit of counsel and of might, the Spirit of the knowledge and fear of the Lord—and he will delight in the fear of the Lord.

He will not judge by what he sees with his eyes, or decide by what he hears with his ears;

4but with righteousness he will judge the needy, with justice he will give decisions for the poor of the earth. He will strike the earth with the rod of his mouth; with the breath of his lips he will slay the wicked.

5Righteousness will be his belt and faithfulness the sash around his waist.

6The wolf will live with the lamb,
the leopard will lie down with the goat,
the calf and the lion and the yearling together;
and a little child will lead them.
7The cow will feed with the bear,
their young will lie down together,
and the lion will eat straw like the ox.

The infant will play near the cobra's den, and the young child will put its hand into the viper's nest.
They will neither harm nor destroy on all my holy mountain,
for the earth will be filled with the knowledge of the LORD as the waters cover the sea.

<sup>10</sup>In that day the Root of Jesse will stand as a banner for the peoples; the nations will rally to him, and his resting place will be glorious.

#### **SECOND READING: Romans 5:4-13**

Hope in the face of judgment

<sup>4</sup>For everything that was written in the past was written to teach us, so that through the endurance taught in the Scriptures and the encouragement they provide we might have hope.

<sup>5</sup>May the God who gives endurance and encouragement give you the same attitude of mind toward each other that Christ Jesus had, <sup>6</sup>so that with one mind and one voice you may glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ.

<sup>7</sup>Accept one another, then, just as Christ accepted you, in order to bring praise to God. <sup>8</sup>For I tell you that Christ has become a servant of the Jews on behalf of God's truth, so that the promises made to the patriarchs might be confirmed <sup>9</sup>and, moreover, that the Gentiles might glorify God for his mercy. As it is written:

"Therefore I will praise you among the Gentiles; I will sing the praises of your name."

<sup>10</sup>Again, it says,

"Rejoice, you Gentiles, with his people."

<sup>11</sup>And again,

"Praise the Lord, all you Gentiles; let all the peoples extol him."

<sup>12</sup>And again, Isaiah says,

"The Root of Jesse will spring up, one who will arise to rule over the nations; in him the Gentiles will hope."

<sup>13</sup>May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit.

M: The Word of the Lord.

C: Thanks be to God.

#### GOSPEL: Matthew 3:1-12

#### John prepares people to meet the Judge

<sup>1</sup>In those days John the Baptist came, preaching in the wilderness of Judea <sup>2</sup>and saying, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven has come near." <sup>3</sup>This is he who was spoken of through the prophet Isaiah:

"A voice of one calling in the wilderness, 'Prepare the way for the Lord, make straight paths for him.' "

<sup>4</sup>John's clothes were made of camel's hair, and he had a leather belt around his waist. His food was locusts and wild honey. <sup>5</sup>People went out to him from Jerusalem and all Judea and the whole region of the Jordan. <sup>6</sup>Confessing their sins, they were baptized by him in the Jordan River.

<sup>7</sup>But when he saw many of the Pharisees and Sadducees coming to where he was baptizing, he said to them: "You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the coming wrath? <sup>8</sup>Produce fruit in keeping with repentance. <sup>9</sup>And do not think you can say to yourselves, 'We have Abraham as our father.' I tell you that out of these stones God can raise up children for Abraham. <sup>10</sup>The ax is already at the root of the trees, and every tree that does not produce good fruit will be cut down and thrown into the fire.

<sup>11</sup>"I baptize you with water for repentance. But after me comes one who is more powerful than I, whose sandals I am not worthy to carry. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. <sup>12</sup>His winnowing fork is in his hand, and he will clear his threshing floor, gathering his wheat into the barn and burning up the chaff with unquenchable fire."

M: This is the Gospel of our Lord.

C: Praise be to you, O Christ!

#### **CONFESSION OF FAITH**

#### The Nicene Creed
